

### Kiss & Go

The "No Parking" sign with complimentary "Kiss and Go" zone allows vehicles to stop for a sufficiently short period (less than 2 minutes) to set down or pick up children without leaving the vehicle. This zone is designated by the matching green sign and linemarking.

#### Drop off time

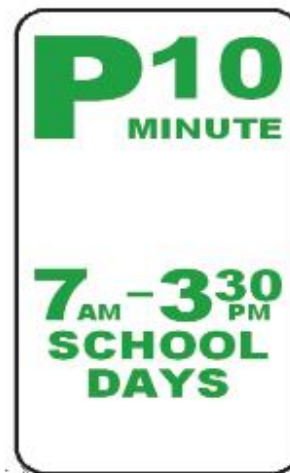
Pull in, with your child sitting in the rear passenger seat closest to the kerb, kiss them goodbye, let them out of the car, indicate and pull away safely freeing-up the space for the next parent.

#### Pick up time

Pull in and wait in the car for your children to walk across the footpath, and get into the car via the kerbside passenger door. Indicate before pulling out safely and clearing the zone.

#### Tips to help you

Don't have school bags in the boot. Place them on the floor at your child's feet for easy access. If the green zone is full - Don't stress! A lap around the block will allow the zone to clear.



### Wait A While

The "10 min" parking sign with complimentary "Wait a While" zone allows sufficient time for parents to accompany their children into or out of school. This zone is designated by the matching pink sign and linemarking.

#### Drop off time

Pull in, park and walk your child in to class, before returning to the car, reversing out carefully and clearing the zone for other parents.

#### Pick up time

Pull in, park, while you wait briefly. There is just enough time to allow you to walk into the classrooms and collect your children, before reversing out with care and clearing the zone for the next parent.

#### Tips to help you

Make sure your children know which zone to expect you to park in, instruct them to wait for you to get within sight before approaching the car.



### Stop & Chat

The "No Limit" parking sign with complimentary "Stop & Chat" zone replaces the traditional all day parking. This zone is designated by the matching purple sign and linemarking.

#### Drop off time

In the morning if you intend to stay at the school to help with reading or other activities, this is the zone to park in.

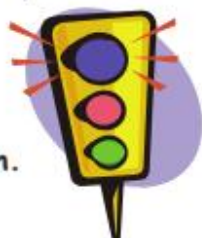
#### Pick up time

If you need to arrive before 3.30pm or are staying after school this is where you can park and leave your car.

#### To Assist

Teachers will continue to park in their own car park leaving spaces free for parents.

# School Parking is always about Safety!

The provision of school parking is a challenge that the Darwin City Council faces constantly. Meeting the demands of all road users around schools is not easy! The Council is committed to improving safety and encouraging greater co-operation from all road users at School Set down and Pick up times.

Used in conjunction with the new colour coded parking zones are the regulatory parking signs and yellow lines to allow regulatory services staff to undertake enforcement if required.

If the Kiss & Go zone is full - don't panic. A lap around the block should allow sufficient time for the zone to clear. Remember that double parking is not only illegal but dangerous and encourages poor road use behaviour in our children.



Always use the rear kerbside passenger "Safety Door" even at the shops or at home! Good habits save lives.

Ultimately the success of this new system relies on the support of our school community.

Darwin City Council's Regulatory staff will support this program by allowing parents to become familiar with the new layout before commencing enforcement programs.

Remember our children expect us to keep them safe, so we should not risk their lives just getting them to and from school.

School crossings are cool! They are the safest places to cross the road around our school.
